PCAT-LIFE (After School Literacy Enrichment Program)

UCM's PCAT-LIFE After School Literacy Program is up and running! We are excited to be once again aiding young children and their families in becoming literacy rich and to provide them with the guidance in life skills to become successful members of our community.

The PCAT-LIFE Program is an after school literacy enrichment program that targets first grade children and their families. The first grade students admitted into our program have been identified by their teachers as reading below a desired reading level and who are demonstrating poor academic achievement. The PCAT-LIFE Program is being held at Bellamy Elementary School located at 9720 Wilsky Boulevard, Tampa, FL 33615 Hillsborough County. Bellamy Elementary has a student population of 81% minority and 80% free and reduced lunch. Most of the minority population is of Hispanic descent and a large contributing factor to the students' poor academic performance is that a great majority of the parents do not speak English. The lack of English speaking parents causes lack of communication, lack of educational support and at times, frustration between parents, students and teachers.

Parents are also encouraged to participate and set positive examples for their children by attending English classes, utilizing Rosetta Stone English and attending life skills and career advancement trainings offered. Family Fun Nights will be planned quarterly to celebrate the accomplishments of the children and encourage family and community support for continued success.

Currently we are tutoring eight students; however, we have fourteen students on our waiting list. We have several volunteering opportunities available.

BOWL FOR HOPE



University Community Ministries, Inc. will be holding its third annual bowl-a-thon on Saturday, March 23, 2013. The 2013 *Bowl for Hope* is a fun event and important to UCM's annual fundraising efforts. This year's *Bowl for Hope* is sponsored by USAmeriBank. The event will be held at Splitsville Luxury Lanes, which is located at 615 Channelside Drive, Tampa, Florida 33602. There will be food for each bowler and great raffle prizes will be given away every 15 minutes. Splitsville has donated six lanes for this year's event.

UCM is providing program volunteers and/or their guest with the opportunity to form a team of six bowlers. A team of six bowlers will be assigned to each of the six lanes available for the event (a total of 36 bowlers).
